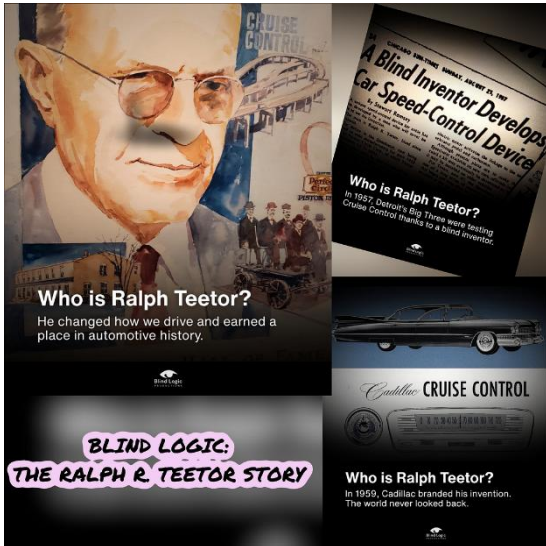


New BLIND LOGIC documentary floods streaming platforms with multiple forms of light
